My Lord,

I had the honor of addressing
Your Lordship under date of the 25th ultimo,
and I have now that of enclosing a Duplicate
thereof, as well as to enclose a statement of
the Case of the Spanish Slave Ship Josefa.

As my Colleague Don Francisco
Le Fee, the Spanish Commissioner, Judge,
does not conceive himself authorized to bring
the abovesaid Case of the Josefa into
consideration, on account of its being unknown
whether or not Capt. Willis, the Captain,
was provided with the special Instructions
alluded to in the 7th and 11th articles of
the Treaty of the 23rd September 1807, I
have not deemed it necessary to press the
matter upon him: especially, as I conceive
that no detriment can happen, either to
the Captain or to the Captives, by delaying the
Ship being sunk, and the few unfortunate
Slaves
