

just before the capture of the *Vespa*, left her in the long boat, taking with him ten Slaves.

The crew of the *Josefa* consisted of thirty three men, twenty Spaniards and thirteen Foreigners, principally Americans.

Even the Supercargo directed the course of the Ship, and pointed out to the Master the Places where he intended to trade for Slaves.

Such is, in abstract, the declaration on oath, of the Master of the *Josefa*. - His avowal of the fact of Forty five Slaves having been purchased betwixt Cape Mesurado and Cape Apollonia, corroborated by the circumstance of part of the Slaves having been found on board at the time of the capture; and the Ship not being in possession of the requisite Royal Licenses, are more than proofs sufficient to stamp the Voyage with illegality.
