Extract from a letter dated Old Calabar
River, Aug. 8th 1824, addressed by Lieutenant
Knight, Commanding H. M. S. Brig.
Snapper, to J. G. Alvarado Esquire, H.
M. S. Company Judge. 169

"I have enquired as particularly as
I can about the circumstance of the
Master of the vessel the Tartar took
(the Constantia) who is or was in prison
at Sierra Leone for carrying off a Free
man from this place. - I find that
the Portuguese is not guilty of the charge,
as the man was sold by Duke Ephraim
(for ravishing his Father's wives) in
preference to putting him to death, as is
the law generally at this place, that
is, when there is not a Slave Ship
for reception of criminals.
