consideration of the said Portuguese Schooner Adelaide  
adjourned from Thursday the 13<sup>th</sup> Instant and  
proceeded to the examinations on oath of Joaquim  
de Saizga a sailor belonging to the said Schooner  
upon Standing Interrogatories, and Jose Ghy de Araujo  
Master of said Vessel on Special Interrogatories. The said  
Commissioner Judges on the close of their examinations  
were of opinion, that she was illegally engaged in the  
traffic of Slaves, North of the Equator at the time of her  
detention, but in consequence of the absence of A. B. M.  
Commissioner of Arbitration at the Colonial Quarter  
sessions, they deferred pronouncing judgment until  
the presence of that Gentleman - After which the Court  
adjourned until Monday the 17<sup>th</sup> Instant.
