Tuesday the 1st January 1822.

Agreeable to the Minute of Adjournment of
Yesterday the Board met, and the Acting Registrar
having submitted to the Commissioners the Accounts
of the Sale of the Hull and Stores of the Spanish
Schooner Anna Maria, and it appearing that
the Nett Proceeds of the said Vessel amounted to
the Sum of One Hundred and fifty nine Pounds,
eleven Shillings and three pence Sterling, It
was resolved that the Nett Proceeds of the same
be paid into the Military Chest of this Colony,
without any Division being made of the Moiety
of the said Proceeds appertaining to the Crown
of Spain, in order to the better Security of the
said Moiety during the absence of the Comm^{rs}
on the part of His Catholic Majesty, and that the
Acting Registrar do take proper receipts for the
said payment from the Officer in charge of
the Military Chest.
