COURT OF MIXED COMMISSION,

SIERRA LEONE.

In the Case of the Portuguese Schooner "Adelaide" whereof Jose Glez de Araujo was Master, seized and taken by His Britannic Majesty's Ship Phœasant B. M. Kelly, Esquire, Commander and condemned in the said Court for illicit traffic in Slaves.

Received, the Eighteenth day of June in the year of our Lord the thousand eight hundred & twenty two out of the Registry of the said Court of Mixed Commission, the Sum of Three Hundred and Eight Pounds, twelve shillings and a penny halfpenny currency of Sierra Leone, said to be the moiety of the proceeds arising from the sale of the said Schooner "Adelaide" and cargo, for which I have signed seven Receipts, of the same tenor and date, to serve as one.

The above amount is equal at the prevailing rate of exchange, viz. Ten pounds per cent advance upon sterling to the sum of Two Hundred and Eighty pounds seven shillings and a farthing.
