

The Case of the Spanish Schooner
Nuestra Señora de las Nieves alias Voladora
Comd^o Lopez Master

This Vessel (which was brought into Terra Leone on the 28th December) was fitted out in June last at the Havannah and furnished with a Royal Passport to trade for Slaves South of the Equator.

She was captured on the Night of the 15th ultimo by the Boats of H. M. S. Myrindon, Captⁿ John Leake, in Lat^o 7° North and Long^o 12° West, in the neighbourhood of the Gallinas where between the 29th October and 11th December she had taken One hundred and twenty two Slaves, all of whom were found on
